Role Specific

- 1. Take responsibility for qualifications and work as part of a team as well as independently striving to continuously improve the performance and learner experience.
- 2. Teach on the BA(Hons) Health and Applied Social Studies programme though not exclusively.
- 3. Contribute to ensuring all public information is up to date and correct at all times, this includes all programme materials, VLE and website
- 4. Identify areas for new programmes and assist in their development with a particular focus upon Health and Higher Level Apprenticeships
- 5. Work across the whole of the Higher Education Division and other curriculum areas as and when required.

- 7. Contribute to ensuring that relevant learner data is accurately collected and passed to the Programme Leaders, HE Office, MIS and exams where applicable
- 8. Attend and contribute to moderation and team meetings on a regular basis
- 9. Ensure adherence to both College, HEI and Awarding Bodies policies, quality requirements and codes of practice
- 10. Maintain a highly motivated approach to continuous professional development, which will include attending and contributing to staff development days/events within college
- 11. Responsibility for promoting and safeguarding the welfare of children, young people and vulnerable adults
